 - 2. To create a proclamation from NABCD on each occurrence to be sent to home parishes
 - 3. To contribute \$250.00 to IBSC in the name of each honored deacon and spouse, detailed clarifications to be resolved
- Develop a stable financial strategy to support our organization's programs and services
- Develop an online workshop approach to teaching germane subjects such as Spirituality, Spoken Word and Social Justice. The idea is to develop a consistent and broad presence electronically such that all members can participate.
- Develop a speaker's bureau using all the talents within the Black Deacon Community.
- Build membership growth and development strategies based on the data gathered from our last year needs assessment.

Many of us are busy in your communities working for peace, justice and an increase in vocations. For me active participation on the Seattle Archdiocese's Black Catholic Advisory Commission keeps me busy.

As servant ordained to serve the church, all of you are to be commended for your work with the homeless, youth, the elderly, prison ministry, education and church administration. May God continue to bless you with good health and strength to preserver.
