Black Catholic History Month Celebration

Presentation

The Archdiocese of Seattle Black Catholic Advisory Circle, Immaculate Conception Parish, and Seattle University Campus Ministry, Center for Jesuit Education, and Institute for Catholic Thought and Culture celebrate Black Catholic History Month with an event on **November 14 at 4 p.m.-5:30p.m. (Pacific),** with an evening of conversation, music, and reflection with Dr. Ansel Augustine.

Audience- Seattle University and parishes of BCAC, others

Topic - Living Witnesses: Black Catholic Faith Past, Present, and Promise

Objective of the presentation – We desire to create a space of learning and encounter that lifts up the rich history and stories of Black Catholic faith, and invites attendees to reflect on its implications for the present and future of the Catholic Church. Attendees will reflect on their own experience of bringing their whole selves in all its richness as gift to the Church, and will imagine how to live as a Body of Christ that offers these spaces for all. We hope this event, aimed at both college aged students and wider Seattle Catholic community, will inspire and energize participants to learn about Black Catholic history, reflect on our current reality in its opportunities and challenges, and imagine ways forward for the Church.

Context/Purpose: Inspired by <u>Sr. Thea Bowman's address to the USCCB in 1989</u>, where she posed the question "What does it mean to be Black and Catholic"? And answered: "It means that I come to my Church fully functioning.... I bring myself, my black self, all that I am, all that I have, all that I hope to become, I bring my whole history, my traditions, my experience, my culture, my African-American song and dance and gesture and movement and teaching and preaching and healing and responsibility as gift to the Church."

Content/Flow of the evening (4-5:30 p.m. Seattle; 6-7:30p.m. Louisiana)

We envision the evening taking 1.5 hours, with an approximately 20 minute presentation by Dr. Augustine, in 3 parts. The 3 main questions being answered by Dr. Augustine. Between each response there will be a song to transition between movements. The music will help give participants a prayerful experience that shows the gifts of Black Catholic worship. Music will be shared by Sherell Mitchell (Director of Music at Immaculate Conception Church), and Bill McNamara (Campus Minister for Liturgical Music)
